




Year 3 - Willow & Elm



School Admin Update

Don't be late for the gate!

School **starts at 8.55am** for children in Reception-Year 6. A teacher is on duty in the playground from 8.45am and gates open at this time.

Families that arrive after 8.55am will be diverted to the front office where children should be signed in and provide a reason for being late.

Nursery **starts at 8.45am or 12.30pm** depending on your child's session. Families arriving after the Nursery gates have been closed must also bring children to the front office to be signed in and provide a reason for lateness. Once signed in, parents/carers must wait in the lobby with their child until a member of staff is available to escort children to Nursery.

Please ensure you allow enough time for your journey to school, building in an extra 10mins to allow for potential heavy traffic It's better to be early than late!

Parents/carers of children that regularly arrive late will be asked to meet with the Head Teacher.
