


## Year 5 - Chestnut & Sycamore



### Admin Update

With half term approaching, a reminder to all that there is no entitlement to holiday during term time. Periods of unauthorised term time leave are reported to the School Attendance Support Service (SASS) and parents/carers are at risk of receiving a Penalty Notice Warning Letter / Penalty Notice.

We regularly analyse attendance data to identify patterns of absence. Sickness absence immediately before and/or after school holidays will not be automatically authorised.

Penalty Warning Letters / Penalty Notices are also considered if a child has had 10 sessions (five school days) of unauthorised absence in a period of 10 school weeks. The period of 10 school weeks can span different terms or years. A school week means any week in which there is at least one school session. The threshold can be met with any combination of unauthorised absence eg. four sessions of holiday taken in term time and six sessions of arriving late after the registers have closed.
